About the Field Study option

ACICIS offers advanced language students capable of independent study the opportunity to undertake field study through Universitas Muhammadiyah, Malang (UMM). Students usually undertake the Field Study option following a semester at Universitas Gadjah Mada, though it may be taken as a first semester option also. A number of students have incorporated their projects into an undergraduate honours program with the approval of their home university.

The closing date for applications is 1 October for the semester starting in January and 1 May for the semester starting in August.

What's involved

ACICIS students:

- * attend a 2-week lecture and seminar series;
- * are allocated an UMM staff member who provides academic supervision;
- * undertake a two-month period of field study;
- * submit a final report at the end of semester;
- * present their findings in Indonesian at a seminar attended by UMM students, staff, and the ACICIS Resident Director.

Past students have written reports on topics as diverse as: Christian-Muslim relations, language policy, attitudes towards polygamy, environmental disasters, gender and development, and labour migration.
