About the Journalism Professional Practicum

What is involved?

Spend six weeks in the bustling metropolis of Jakarta, learning about the country and its thriving media industry.

The JPP is designed to provide students of journalism, media and communication studies, and cadet journalists, with the opportunity to live and work in Jakarta's diverse and dynamic media scene. Students will deepen their understanding of Indonesia whilst developing their journalism skills within an international media environment.

Important Dates

The 2010 JPP program will be held from: 31 December 2009 to 12 February 2010.
Application deadline is 1 September 2009.

What is offered?

- *2 weeks intensive Indonesian language classes (morning);
- *2 weeks of workshops and presentations by industry representatives on Indonesian history, politics, and media (afternoon);
- *series of field trips;
- *4-week industry placement at an English language media organisation, learning the ropes and working alongside seasoned Indonesian reporters and international correspondents.
