What is Involved

Students who study in Indonesia with ACICIS normally spend their first semester at Universitas Gadjah Mada (UGM) in Yogyakarta. The program at UGM allows students to choose a mix of Indonesian language and other regular curriculum subjects in accordance with the language ability and interest of the student. A placement test at UGM combined with assistance from the ACICIS staff in Yogya will guide students in their choice of subjects.

Application Closing Dates

1 October for the semester starting in January and 1 May for the semester starting in August. Application forms can be downloaded from the website.

What is offered

- * pre-departure readings to help orientate and acculturate participants;
- * VITAS visa processing;
- * 4-day orientation program;
- * in-country student support with three full-time staff based in Indonesia;
- * personal tutor for the semester;
- * a range of extra curricular activities.
