About the Islamic Studies Program

ACICIS offers a semester-long program on Islamic Studies. Subjects are taught in English at Universitas Islam Indonesia (UII) in Yogyakarta, Central Java. No prior knowledge of Indonesian is required and everyone is welcome to apply. ACICIS also offers one scholarship per semester for a student to study at UII.

Universitas Islam Indonesia (UII)

UII is a progressive centre for Islamic research with modern facilities. Islamic values and customs shape the daily lives of the majority of UII students, however, the atmosphere is very open and welcoming to people from all countries, cultures and religions.

What is involved

- * 4 day live-in orientation program;
- * full-time support from ACICIS in-country staff;
- * the option to specialise in Islamic Business; Islamic Law or Islamic Society;
- * an English-speaking tutor from UII;
- * Indonesian and/or Arabic language units;
- * an internship at a local organisation.

The internship is taken alongside other subjects and will provide students with valuable international and professional experience. This unit will enhance their understanding of Islam and the challenges of living and working in a developing economy.
